
WELCOME TO THE HOMEOWNER FORUM



Diminish Dust Mites

ust mites account for 80% of allergy suffering within the home. The microscopic creatures thrive in dark, humid environments like beds, blankets, carpets, stuffed animals and drapery. Elimination of dust mites is virtually impossible because of their reproduction rates, but there are simple, effective steps to reduce exposure to dust mite allergens.

- ✓ Encase bed mattresses, box springs and pillows in allergen-impermeable encasings. Wash all bed linens in hot water every two weeks.
- Keep the humidity in your home below 50 percent. Use air conditioning or a dehumidifier to reduce humidity.
- Prevent heavy dust build-up by removing carpeting and thick rugs. Bare surfaces such as hard wood, linoleum or tile are inhospitable to dust mites.
- ✓ Vacuum and dust furniture at least once a week.
- Children allergic to dust mites should have a limited amount of stuffed animals in their bedrooms.
