Treasurers Report - August 2004

As of August 31, 2004 the association has a total of \$196,317 in their checking accounts, mutual funds, and CDs. There is still \$33,650 outstanding in uncollected assessments and legal fees.

Total expenditures for August 2004 were \$31,423. All of these expenses were routine operating expenses for the association. Total year-to-date expenses through July 31, 2004 total \$154,763. A summary of the significant expenses made to date are as follows:

- 21% for Patrol Services; conducted for Constables Precinct 4
- 19% for Pool Management, Lifeguards and Pool Maintenance; contracted to Southwest Pools
- 13% for Street Lights; paid to Reliant Energy
- 7% for Collection Efforts; performed by SCS Management Services
- 7% for Insurance

- 5% for Deed Restriction Inspection and Enforcement; performed by SCS Management Services and Butler and Hailey
- 4% for Billing and Accounting Services, performed by SCS Management Services
- 4% for Gates and Fence Improvements; performed by Peet Services
- 5% for Landscaping and Mowing Services; contracted to Troy's Landscaping
- 3% for Management Administration Services; conducted by SCS Management Services
- 2% for Water and Sewer; paid to Reid Road MUD
- The remaining 11% are miscellaneous items that range from repairs, audit, bank fees, postage, printing, taxes, telephone, mosquito fogging, etc.

Due to tightened purse strings our year-to-date expenses are approximately \$28,004 less than what we originally projected and our revenue is approximately \$449 over where we projected we would be at this point this year. So overall we are in pretty good shape for August 2004; however, if our uncollected assessments and legal fees do not dramatically improve our revenue picture could look a whole lot different in the coming months.

Our overall expenses are up significantly from last month and this is attributed to several July invoices that were paid in August that should have been paid in July. Our insurance premiums, totaling \$10,469, were paid during the month of August. A check was cut in error during August for landscaping services totaling \$2,403 SCS will be crediting this amount back to our account in September.
