HOUSTON & BAYTOWN TX- What did you do this summer? This summer over 3,000 youth, ages 14-17, found adventure and training through the Naval Sea Cadet Corps, on shore and afloat, young male and female cadets explore careers in the Navy and Coast Guard through varied training programs and activities. Developing good citizenship, a greater sense of responsibility, leadership skills and self-discipline are other objectives of the program.

Sponsored by the U.S. Navy League, the Department of the Navy and Coast Guard, the Naval Sea Cadet Corps is a federally chartered youth training organization. The program is open to all young Americans regardless of race, color, creed or sex.

Sea Cadet training helps young people to make an intelligent decision about choosing a career and discover if they are suited for military service. Cadets advancing in the Naval Sea Cadet Corps can enlist in advanced pay grades in the Navy or Coast Guard. About 70 percent of all cadets completing the Naval Sea Cadet Corps program will enter the armed forces.

Make sure your children know how to get in touch with you. Tell them exactly how long you will be gone. Keep the time frame short at first, and be home on time.

Be sure your child is clear about the rules of what they can or cannot do while you are gone. For example, is cooking or baking allowed?

Instruct children to call 911 if someone gets seriously hurt. Post your home address and emergency contact numbers by all telephones. Be sure children know where the first aid kit is and teach them how to treat a minor cut. Contact the Red Cross (www.redcross.org) for first aid training classes, such as FACT (First Aid for Children Today) or BAT (Basic Aid Training).

Enlist the help of trustworthy neighbors to be a resource for emergencies.

Antiperational Household Tips

Have your children memorize "stall" statements that indicate an adult is home but unavailable for phone calls: *My dad can't come to the phone right now. Can I take a message?*

Use the same strategy for visitors and don't open the door to strangers. Tell delivery people – through the closed door – to leave packages outside.

ake advantage of the dry weather to look around your home's exterior for areas that need maintenance. You will protect the value of your home and prevent more costly repairs that could occur. For instance:

Scrape and touch up paint that is cracked or peeling. Caulk gaps around doors and windows. Examine the foundation for cracks, leaks, or blocked vents. Pressure wash your driveway, patio, and sidewalks to remove oil residue, dirt, and weeds. Repair small cracks with crack filler. Seal asphalt/black top/hot top driveways every other year.
