Open Residents Meeting Message from the Board

Thank you to all who attended the Quarterly Open residents meeting on Monday, August 6th. We had a nice turnout of residents interested in the goings-on in Steeplechase. Our next Open Residents meeting will be held in the Clubhouse at 7pm on Monday, November 5th.

Much discussion at this meeting focused on our newly formed swim team as well as our long-standing water aerobic classes; these groups use our outstanding set-up of pools—the main Jr. Olympic size pool and the adult pool on the upper deck. Some of the Swim Team parents have brought a lot of focus to our pool areas, which like all of our community facilities and infrastructure is aging. The Board continually faces the reality of addressing the needs of a community built in the 1980s and must spread our limited resources throughout the subdivision.

The community center was purchased by the Steeplechase CIA in 2002 and each year improvements have been made. There remain a number of items to be addressed—tennis court resurfacing and lighting, clubhouse flooring, electrical and plumbing improvements. The Board will continue to prioritize what projects need to be done first for the betterment and safety of the community. Many have noticed the new lighting and security cameras at the club. The Steeplechase Board strives to continue the investment in quality facilities and enhance the enjoyment for all.

The Board is always looking for more volunteers to serve on committees that will oversee services and recommend actions to be taken by the Board. We had a great turnout at National Night Out on August 7th and many of you signed-up for committees or volunteered to serve as a “block captain” in our revival of the crime watch program. 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Aging Gracefully? Maybe not...

We all know some handle aging better than others. The Graying of America that we have been anticipating for decades is here with a bang, with a record number of Baby Boomers passing the “60+” milestone. In northwest Harris County, many of our older neighborhoods are now over 30 years old...which means that along with a significant portion of the area’s residents, our community’s infrastructure is aging, too. Many of the components in our water and sewer system have already far exceeded their ‘life expectancy’.

The recent bridge collapse in Minnesota has tragically reminded us what happens when the condition of our infrastructure is ignored. We tend to take for granted all the “economic underpinnings” that make our communities and this nation work – systems for transportation (our roads and bridges), electric and water utilities, and telecommunications.

Unfortunately, when it comes to the underground system that delivers our drinking water, there aren’t any quick ‘fixes’. We’re getting to the point where the remedy needs to go beyond careful monitoring...all the way to replacement. Earlier this year, both of the District’s water wells were down at the same time, which forced us to rely solely on ‘interconnect agreements’ with surrounding Municipal Utility Districts for our drinking water. The District had already been aggressively replacing old sanitary sewer lines and had a long range plan for accomplishing significant repairs to the complete system. This water well emergency prompted the Board of Directors of Harris County Municipal Utility District 168 to prioritize drilling an additional well in addition to updating our aging infrastructure. With the last remaining bond funds being allocated to sewer repairs, the Board subsequently addressed the need for a BOND election in order to generate the necessary funding for these new and ongoing projects.

The Directors want to keep you posted on the condition of your water systems and other critical water-related issues so you can learn more about the challenges we face in providing the quality and quantity of drinking water you expect and deserve. In addition, while sewer and water treatment systems aren’t generally topics for daily household discussion, we want you to understand the issues related to providing those services, as well.

We will be reaching out in new ways to our neighbors and customers in the months ahead. Watch your mailboxes for Water Works! -- our newsletter that will focus on important water supply topics, tips on using this precious natural resource more efficiently, and other ‘homeowner-friendly’ subjects we hope you’ll find of interest. There are some long range decisions to be made that will require additional funding, and we will invite you to join us for a Town Hall meeting to discuss an upcoming bond election. We will also be including a customer survey in your water bill...and we urge you to take a few minutes to share your opinions and concerns by completing and returning it.

There is a lot to be accomplished in the months ahead, and we look forward to working with you to accomplish some important goals and to make sure that there will be an adequate supply of quality drinking water to meet the needs of the next generation!

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


Newsletter Submissions Requested

RECYCLING UPDATE

WCA Waste, our trash provider, has changed collection vehicles for the recycle program. Vista Fibers, the recycle processor, is only accepting single stream recycling. This means that all recyclables are now commingled or mixed together in one compartment/body. In an effort to increase production and because WCA no longer needs to curb-sort the recycling materials, WCA is phasing out their split-body side-load vehicles and has begun using "rear load" type trucks for recycling. These trucks have the same appearance as the trash trucks. Therefore, don't be alarmed if you see WCA personnel putting recyclables in what appears to be a trash truck. It's okay as long as the crew isn't placing trash and recyclables in the same truck in one pass. Recycling collection continues on Wednesdays.
