Maintenance Committee

The Stone Canyon maintenance committee has several on going projects to update and/or repair facilities with the neighborhood.

Irrigation: There has been a lot of work to the irrigation system within Stone Canyon to repair and/or replace timers, control valves, broken pipes, and sprinkler heads. The irrigation system in Stone Canyon public areas should now be in good shape for next year.

Lighting: Many street lights have been repaired in the past few months. The committee is investigating the repair and/or replacement of lighting at the Stone Canyon entrances.

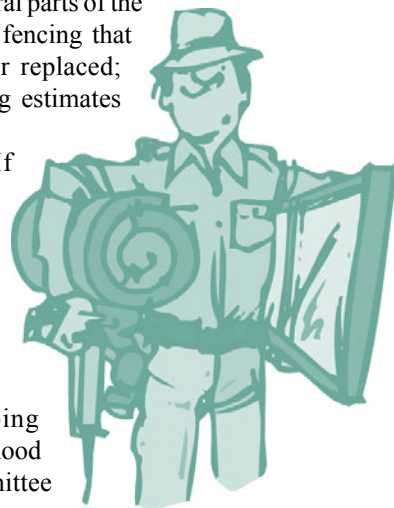
Drainage: The committee is investigating the pooling of water on the side walk of Brightwater between Ancona Trail and Glen Canyon.

Street signs: Many of the street signs in our neighborhood are in need of repair or replacement, so the committee is investigating our options to replace or repaint the signs.

Fence: There are several parts of the neighborhood concrete fencing that needs to be repaired or replaced; currently we are getting estimates for this work.

Architectural Control Committee

The new and approved ACC Guidelines are now posted on our Association's website at www.stonecanyonhoa.org (don't forget to add "oa" following "stonecanyon" or you'll end up in Arizona). Log on to site, open the residents' page, sign in, and link onto ACC Guidelines. If you haven't yet established your password, then follow same procedures to log on to reach the residents' page where you'll find "how to" directions. Due to increasing costs, paper copies of the guidelines are no longer sent out "snail mail." If you don't have access to a computer, undoubtedly one of your neighbors will be happy to make a copy of the guidelines for you.

We are fortunate to live in such a diverse community because we have the opportunity to learn how our neighbors observe and celebrate those occasions most important to their families: Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas, Hanukah, Ramadan and Kwanzaa, as well as other seasonal holidays. Hopefully, you were able to pile your family into the car and spend an evening (or more) driving throughout Stone Canyon and our surrounding neighborhoods during the past several weeks. The bar was really raised this year--lights were more beautiful than ever, along with some especially creative lawn decorating. Round Rock West, along Deepwood Drive, was particularly fun--each year, one of the homes on Deepwood even sets up a special sleigh with reindeer for Santa Claus and Mrs. Claus, so they can visit with all the children, usually in the early evenings during the week before Christmas. If you did some exterior

decorating, THANK YOU! Also, please note the following reminder found in our guidelines: Holiday lights or decorations may be erected on your home's exterior, provided they don't unreasonably disturb the peaceful enjoyment of adjacent homeowners. No lights or decorations may be permanently attached to the home without prior written ACC approval. Also, a reminder that Christmas decorations and lights should not be displayed prior to November 15th and must be removed within 30 days following the holiday. So, if you've not already put your decorations back into storage, you've a few more days to enjoy the fruits of your labor.

Two concerns keep popping up:

Pet "Deposits"... It's helpful to carry a plastic bag when you are walking your pet, so you can take care of "poop scoop" duty on the spot. Remember, no one likes to find the nasty stuff along sidewalks, in the playgrounds, or in their yards. Another reminder--Stone Canyon's deed restrictions do require all pets (dogs AND cats) to be leashed when not on their owner's property. Please be a courteous and responsible pet owner and neighbor.

Excessive Noise... There has been an increase of "radios with cars" driving through the neighborhood, especially at night. Most of us enjoy music, but not the vibrations and accompanying "boom boom boom" caused by such excess. Again, a little courtesy goes a long way and is always appreciated.

Please remember to send your requests for ACC approval to Bob Nardo, our property manager (contact info below). Forms can be obtained from Bob, as well as from our website (www.stonecanyonhoa.org, click on ACC link). Submitting your completed request forms at least 30 days in advance allows for thorough committee review and processing. All required info is noted on the form, including the need for your property plat, detailed plans and materials for your proposed project; the more specific the info, the better. If you have any questions about whether or not your project requires ACC approval, please contact Bob. If you have any concerns about a deed restriction violation which may not be resolved easily through neighborly interaction, Bob will assist you as well. All DRV reports remain confidential and your name will not be released to any other resident. PLEASE HELP US HELP YOU!
