

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Trails System and Parks Plan to Provide Recreational Opportunities and Protect Home Values

Northwest Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 5 residents will have an opportunity to vote in a Parks Bond Election scheduled for May 9, 2009, to approve funding of an extensive system of walking trails and neighborhood park improvements throughout the District. However, The MUD will not build these parks or borrow the money to do so unless the repayment and construction can be performed without an increase in taxes.

The *Parks Master Plan* was developed by a special District Advisory Group, comprised of representatives of the MUD board and Homeowner Associations within the District, working closely with park planning experts and the MUD Board staff.

They have designed the Plan to take advantage of existing pipeline easements, drainage ditches and detention ponds. With the approval of District residents, the MUD will be eligible to apply for matching funds from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and local sources.

Dave Wilson, District resident and Village of Indian Trails HOA President, said he is pleased with the effort to date. "A lot of hard work and careful consideration has been put into developing the Master Plan. We're all looking forward to the next phase, consulting on the implementation and construction details as we move toward construction. This is truly a very flexible plan so that each subdivision will help be able to guide projects that provide maximum benefits."

Village Creek is one of 13 subdivisions in the MUD District, along with Fairwood, the Reserve at Cypress Creek, the Settlement at Cypress Creek, Rock Creek, Lakewood Oaks Estates, Forest Creek Farms, Oakcrest, Tree Line, Lakes at NorthPointe, Grant Meadows, Haydon Lakes, and Village of Indian Trails subdivisions.

Jim Adams, President of Fairwood Homeowners Association and member of the planning group, also feels strongly that the Plan is on the right track. "This is an excellent template for future trails and parks and will be accomplished in currently underutilized areas," he said. "In addition to adding recreational opportunities so appreciated by family members of all ages, research has demonstrated that this kind of trail system and park amenities have a significant positive impact on community property values."

According to Jim Burke, General Manager of the District, "The Board plans to stage the projects so that costs can be absorbed into the District's existing financial structure. Continued growth in the District allows us to commit to a plan without tax increases." With the Plan as a guide" he explained, "the MUD will work closely with residents and homeowner associations in designing, construction and operation of the parks and trails. In addition to providing facilities that are safe and well maintained on an ongoing basis, our purpose is to increase both the residents' quality of life and their property values."

Election Day voting will be 7:00 a.m. to 7 p.m. On Saturday, May 9, 2009 at the MUD building in Fairwood subdivision, 14701 Spring Cypress. Early voting will be between 8 am and 4 pm - April 27, thru May 5t.








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School News

 1 onion, finely chopped Salt & pepper to taste


Directions
