BOARD NOTES

The Heatherwood Village monthly board meeting was held on Thursday, August 5th at the Heatherwood clubhouse.

- The Board discussed three (3) contractor bids to repair the exterior siding on the clubhouse. Nalley Custom Homes was awarded the contract for this work at a total cost of \$3,813.00.
- A resolution was passed by the board prohibiting the use of any and all audio/video recording devices at board meeting proceedings.
- Bids are being solicited for the replacement of the reader boards at the Forest Lodge and Willow Branch locations.
- Ten (10) demand letters were sent to homeowners by the subdivision attorney for the collection of delinquent assessments. One lawsuit has been filed regarding delinquent assessments.
- Harris County Precinct 4 was contacted regarding the removal of graffiti from the footbridge.
- Previously board approved soap and paper towel dispensers for the clubhouse restrooms have been ordered and will be installed shortly.

The Association is dedicated to making a conscious effort to cut subdivision costs. Heatherwood's electric bill runs on an average \$3,000/ month. After the August board meeting, the Board of Directors noticed the tennis court lights were on, but no one was playing on the courts. Please turn the court lights off when you have finished playing. 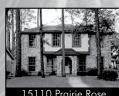














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
