- One neighbor's daughter bakes a mean cupcake.
- If you work late, there is a chance your wife will take all the beer out of your house and distribute it to the neighbors at a block party before you get home.

But most of all, I learned that everyone regretted that we do not get together like this more often. We vowed to try to get together twice a year to visit in the cul-de-sac.

In the end, I felt like I really got to know my neighbors. Before this, there were neighbors that I cordially wave at when I see them coming home and that was about it. It was great to have relaxing conversations and laugh with one another talking about life...and nothing at all. We have so many different backgrounds, cultures, and personalities and it was great to see the interplay between everyone. I would encourage others to get together with your neighbors as the rewards are worthwhile.


