Functional phones are reconditioned and reprogrammed before being sold to wholesalers from more than 40 countries. Phones that cannot be resold are dismantled and recycled. It's easy to protect the planet and our environment by simply collecting obsolete cell phones and recycling them.

- The average person upgrades their phone every 16 months.
- An estimated 130 million phones will be retired this year in the United States.



• Approx. 202,000 ounces of gold could be recovered if these phones had been recycled.
