### WHAT IS BUS BUDDIES?

Bus Buddies is a partnership between the Cy-Fair community and Cypress-Fairbanks Independent School District to provide assistance to elementary students helping them get off the bus at the correct location. The program requires one "Bus Buddy" per elementary bus the first three days of school. The approximate time commitment is from 2:45 p.m. – 4:45 p.m. on August 22, August 23 and August 24. Your job is to simply assist the bus driver with making sure the children get off the bus at their correct stops.

### WHAT IS REQUIRED?

- (1) Attend one of the training sessions, if not previously trained.
- (2) Arrive and sign in at your assigned school where campus staff will assist you.
- (3) Enjoy helping the kids and driver!



### WHEN AND WHERE IS TRAINING?

Training Sessions will be held at The Berry Center, 8877 Barker Cypress Rd., Cypress, TX.

Training dates: Monday, Aug.15 (9:30 – 10:30 a.m.); Tuesday, Aug.16 (6:30 – 7:30p.m.) and Thursday, Aug.18 (7:30 – 8:30 a.m.).

The Partners in Education (PIE) department is looking for the same strong Bus Buddy support we have enjoyed the past. Making sure that all of our elementary children get off the bus at the correct stop is a very big task. It requires 400+ volunteers in the Cy-Fair community to ride buses to assist the nearly 9000 riders and their drivers.

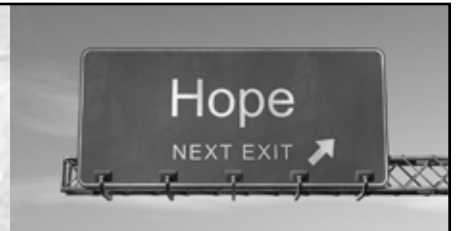

### DROWNING CAN STILL OCCUR EVEN IF YOU KNOW HOW TO SWIM



NO ONE is "drown proof" – no matter their level of swimming ability.

Falls, entrapments, and injuries lead to drowning regardless of swimming level.

### DROWNING IS QUICK AND SILENT



Drowning can occur in less than 2 minutes.



Irreversible brain damage can occur in 4 minutes or less.



Most children are out of sight or missing for less than 5 minutes and usually in the presence of 1 or both parents.



Most children die who are submerged for as little as 6-10 minutes.

Children who drown may not **scream, splash, or struggle**. They can silently slip beneath the water, even with adults & lifeguards present.

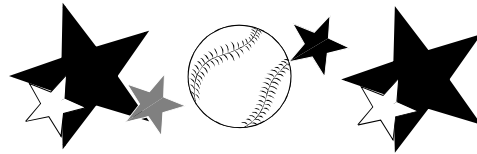
