Let the Kids Play!

In 1986, a group of parents in Katy felt there had to be a better way to provide every youth soccer player a positive experience. They saw the main problem as parents who put too much pressure on the kids to perform. They developed a system so the kids could play and enjoy the sport without demands from adults. They modified the rules and designed a process of 5-aside rules, equal play with a unique equal substitution system, balanced teams, and parent training to ensure that it would be fair. It would be truly "Made for Kids".

Thus Fun-Fair-Positive Soccer (FFPS) was founded in the spring of 1986, by Jack Hendrie and several parents, to establish a positive environment for youth soccer players. The first season of the Katy youth soccer league registered 150 players. In 1995, Jack decided to expand beyond Katy. FFPS has added 21 additional programs in the last 24 years totaling over 16,000 players, with 25,000 players expected by 2016. FFPS is sure to have a youth soccer community near you. 
